Only FIRE CHIEFS may request a free copy of the FSRS. Submit (via e-mail only) an ATTACHED request letter written on fire department letterhead to Blaine Rabe` at brabe@pial.org. The body of the letter must contain the chief's email address. PIAL will validate the requestor's status as Fire Chief and forward the request to ISO. ISO will email you a copy of the schedule.

Why Change?

- Previous schedule copyrighted in 1980
- New schedule copyrighted 2012
 - Reflects the current recognized and accepted standards developed by national standards organizations;
 - Recognizes utilization of advanced technology and best practices in fire mitigation; and
 - Confirms the predictive capability of the evaluation and classification structure.

Community Risk Reduction

This is a new section that includes all of what PIAL has previously offered as "bonus" credit in their "Credit for Public Fire Control Programs" and more....

General Changes

- Section 105 Calculations
 - Credit is limited to 75% of the points possible when only partial documentation of an item exists.
 - When no documentation of an item exists to substantiate an item being reviewed, no credit will be given.

 - **FSRS**: For the purposes of this credit, Pre-incident planning with no component for fire prevention code enforcement are not fire prevention inspections.

Who can do Fire Prevention Inspections?

- FSRS: Certified Fire Inspectors
- **FSRS**: State or Parish fire prevention inspectors or fire marshals with authority for fire prevention code enforcement
- **FSRS**: Fire suppression personnel who perform in-service fire prevention inspections.
- LA Addendum: Only Certified Fire Inspectors working within an authorized fire prevention bureau who have been issued a Fire Inspector Card from the LA Office of the State Fire Marshal.

 - FSRS: All personnel assigned to perform fire prevention inspections shall be certified as fire inspector in accordance with the general criteria of NFPA 1031, Standard for Professional Qualifications for Fire Inspector and Plan Examiner, or equivalent ICC certification.
 - LA Addendum: Licensure as Certified Fire Prevention Inspectors issued by the Office of the Louisiana State Fire Marshal is acceptable documentation of certification. (Other documentation such as IFSAC or Pro-Board may be acceptable.)

Public Fire Safety Educator's Fire Safety Education Course (FSEC) 5 pts

- **FSRS:** All public fire safety education personnel must be trained in methods of teaching as specified by the authority having jurisdiction, in accordance with the general criteria of NFPA 1035, Standard for Professional Qualifications for Fire and Life Safety Educator, Public Information Officer, and Juvenile Firesetter Intervention Specialist.
- LA Addendum: Documentation of qualifications to teach fire safety education courses must be submitted to PIAL with the grading questionnaire. Documentation may include Instructor I Certification.

Section 1031 – Public Fire Safety Educators Qualifications and Training (FSQT): Up to.....10 pts

- **FSRS:** All public fire safety education personnel must participate in continuing education in public fire safety education techniques and processes. They must receive at least 10 hours of additional work-related training each year.
- LA Addendum: Teaching or participation as a presenter of public fire safety education classes does not qualify as continuing education.

 - FSRS: Effectiveness of the residential fire safety program is based on the % of the population reached annually
 - LA Addendum: Departments should have an established program for conveying fire safety information to the public. Program documentation and evidence of use must be submitted to PIAL with the grading questionnaire.
 - Includes all areas of contact...residential, commercial, schools, hospitals and nursing homes

- Fire Safety Education in Schools
 - Classroom Instruction:
 - LA Addendum: Documentation of teaching fire safety education to all students in early childhood education (ECE) programs (Pre-K through 3rd grade) must be submitted to PIAL with the grading questionnaire. All public and private schools teaching Pre-K through 3rd grade students require fire safety education curriculum to earn this credit. Private daycare facilities that do not provide educational services are excluded. These lessons are presented by certified school teachers within the schools located in the graded area. Suitable documentation may include copies of curriculum requirements, lesson plans, or signed statements from school administrators.

- - **FSRS**: The program should refer all juveniles identified as involved in fire-play or firesetting behavior for educational intervention and/or other intervention services.
 - LA Addendum: No further guidance in this document
 - Proof of referral is not required. Credit is based on the existence of a process or program for referral.

- - **FSRS**: Evaluate the fire safety education in occupancies that have large loss potential or hazardous conditions as identified by the authority having jurisdiction.
 - LA Addendum: A list of properties within the graded area identified by the AHJ as having large loss potential or hazardous conditions must be submitted to PIAL with the grading questionnaire.
- At the time of PIAL's field visit, records of fire safety education programs conducted at these properties will be reviewed.

 - **FSRS**: There must be, within or outside the civil jurisdiction, an office with the responsibility to conduct investigations of the causes and origins of fires.
 - LA Addendum: Documents establishing authority to conduct fire cause and origin investigations should be presented to PIAL.

Community Risk Reduction-Fire Investigations Section 1040 – Credit Areas (20 points possible)

- Fire Investigation Organization (up to...... 4 pts)
- Fire Investigation Staffing (up to...... 4 pts)
 - **FSRS**: The jurisdiction must have enough fire investigators to investigate all structure fires.
 - May be paid or volunteer. Includes investigators with authority from the SFM or other civil jurisdiction.
 - LA Addendum: PIAL considers officers with a minimum of Fire Officer I Certification as qualified to perform initial cause and origin investigations. Investigations of all fires deemed suspicious must be performed by the LA OSFM or other certified fire investigators trained to the standards outlined in NFPA 1033. Fires meeting the state statute for mandatory investigation by the LA OSFM must be investigated by the LA OSFM.

Certification

- **FSRS**: All personnel assigned to perform investigation of the causes and origins of fires must be certified, IAW NFPA 1033.
- LA Addendum: Copies of certification documents (minimum of Fire Officer I or Fire Investigator I) for all departmental or outside agency fire investigators including company officers conducting initial cause and origin determinations must be submitted to PIAL with the grading questionnaire. Certification documents need not be submitted for members of the LA OSFM.

Training

- **FSRS**: All personnel assigned to perform investigation of causes and origins of fires must receive at least 40 hours of additional fire investigation training each year.
- LA Addendum: Investigators serving in the position of Fire Investigator require a minimum of 40-hrs of fire investigation related training per year. Other officers performing initial cause and origin determinations require a minimum of 8-hrs of fire investigation related training per year. Submit records from the graded year and two previous years.


Consultants
